

The Student Council students visited the MySayMK conference. This was run by the MK youth council. Whilst there, the students completed a series of workshops some of which we are doing in partnership with Safer:MK & the Police on the campaign topic of Feeling Safe in MK.

We also watched a performance from Alter Ego on the dangers of knife crime and the importance on not carrying blades and how to report crime safely and anonymously. The students were great ambassadors for the school and represented us with pride.







The year 12 biologists carried out ecological field work at Stony Stratford Nature Reserve. They compared the biodiversity of plants between woodland and grassland areas; and of invertebrates between the river and ponds. In the afternoon they also investigated if pollution from the A5 was affecting the habitats by looking for lichens that were affected by different levels of pollution.

The picture is of one of our groups winning the robot racing competition.








A team of Radcliffe School year 9
